Florida SARC Repositioning Under SPCA Florida Umbrella

Lakeland FL - SPCA Florida is on a mission to save lives through a variety of initiatives both locally and nationally. On Wednesday, September 1, 2021, Florida State Animal Response Coalition, FLSARC, a nonprofit 501(c) 3 emergency response organization will officially fall under the SPCA Florida umbrella.

Established in 2011, FLSARC was created to help Florida's dogs and cats during natural and manmade disasters. Trained volunteers or "boots on the ground" assisted with disasters such as Hurricane Matthew and Irma, hoarding cases in multiple Florida counties, and Florida animal shelters during floods and disease control. FLSARC provided emergency animal sheltering for all. Emergency sheltering includes building a temporary shelter, understanding animal behavior & illnesses, and providing daily animal care.

"It has been an amazing 10 years and we have accomplished goals beyond our expectations, but there is more to do, and SPCA Florida is the perfect organization to bring these goals to reality, said FLSARC Founder, Consie von Gontard. "It has been an honor to work with our amazing team of volunteers and I thank you for your continued dedication to our organization," said the retiring, founder.

Shelley Thayer, Executive Director for SPCA Florida, stated, "It is truly an honor to lead this vital program that was created because of tremendous need. FLSARC's mission will remain the same, and we will continue their dedication to disaster mitigation, preparation, response, and recover and care of companion animals. SPCA Florida will take the necessary time to plan and expand on the current curriculum. Full roll-out is expected this year."

"We ask for the continued support of FLSARC volunteers, trainers, sponsors, donors, and state and national organizations who have assisted animals caught in the wake of natural or man-made disasters. SPCA Florida has been helping animals and those who love them for more than 40 years. The merger of FLSARC will support our mission of mercy and care," said Thayer.
